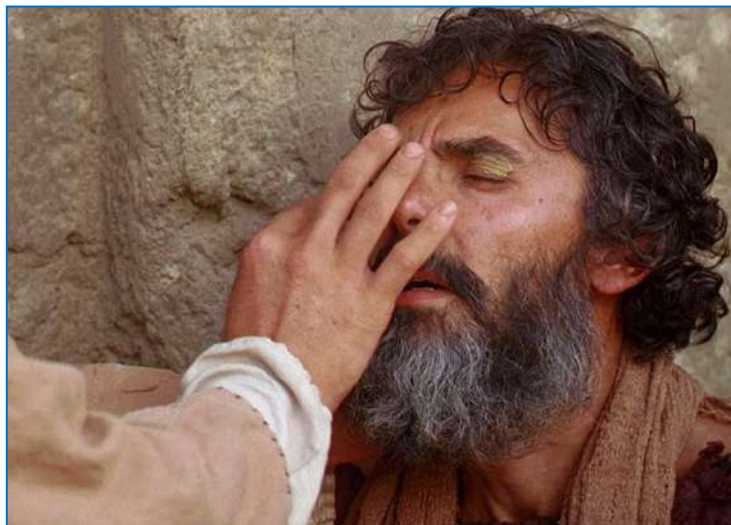

La imposición de manos es un rito muy antiguo. Lo vemos en el Antiguo Testamento para impartir **bendición** y **autoridad**. En el Nuevo Testamento son muchos los momentos en que Jesús lo empleó como signo de **Misericordia**, **Perdón** y **Sanación** y los apóstoles, para comunicar el **don del Espíritu Santo**. Desde el nacimiento de la Iglesia, es usado en la administración de los sacramentos.

Aunque hay un sólo Espíritu, su invocación tiene diferentes connotaciones, según el contexto. En la **Misa** vemos la imposición de manos en la **Consagración** y en la **bendición solemne** al final de la misa. En el sacramento del **Matrimonio** en la bendición a los novios. En la **Confirmación**.

La palabra imposición viene del griego **Epi** (colocar, poner) **Thesis** (sobre); que significa “poner sobre”.

Desde el punto de vista sacramental **sólo el ministro ordenado** tiene la potestad de Cristo.

Jn 14, 15-21

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "Si me aman, cumplirán mis mandamientos; yo le rogaré al Padre y él les dará otro Paráclito para que esté siempre con ustedes, el Espíritu de la verdad. El mundo no puede recibirlo, porque no lo ve ni lo conoce; ustedes, en cambio, sí lo conocen, porque habita entre ustedes y estará en ustedes.

No los dejaré desamparados, sino que volveré a ustedes. Dentro de poco, el mundo no me verá más, pero ustedes sí me verán, porque yo permanezco vivo y ustedes también vivirán. En aquel día entenderán que yo estoy en mi Padre, ustedes en mí y yo en ustedes.

El que acepta mis mandamientos y los cumple, ése me ama. Al que me ama a mí, lo amará mi Padre, yo también lo amaré y me manifestaré a él".

Jesus said to his disciples: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. But you know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you.

I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you.

Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me. And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."

Apreciados hnos y hnas en Cristo resucitado, durante el tiempo litúrgico de la Pascua hemos vivido la experiencia del amor infinito de Dios hacia el hombre. Ahora llega el tiempo de dar a Dios una respuesta de amor en nuestra vida cristiana día a día. "Si me amáis guardaréis mis mandamientos" nos dice Jesús en el evangelio, y nosotros queremos ser coherentes ofreciéndole las obras de nuestro amor. Cuando un amigo se va le decimos cuánto lo queremos, guardamos memoria de los mejores momentos, le hacemos muchas promesas. En el atardecer del jueves santo el cenáculo se transformó en escenario de una despedida, la más histórica, la más trascendental. Jesucristo sabía bien que era el último encuentro que tendría con sus amigos y lo aprovechó para dejarnos como regalo, como recomendación y como promesa: La Sagrada Eucaristía; Su mandamiento de amor; así como la promesa del Espíritu Santo con la abundancia de sus dones. Al relacionar amor y mandamiento, Cristo nos revela su herencia de amor cuando nos olvidamos de nosotros mismos y nos entregamos a los demás, cuando somos solidarios y vemos el rostro de Cristo en el que sufre, en el pobre, en el humilde, en el abandonado, en el pequeño. El amor se hace realidad cuando se cristaliza en obras. Sin pruebas, el amor no es más que un sentimiento noble, pero vacío. Sin pruebas el amor se queda en meras palabras y, al final, resulta una gran decepción. Sin pruebas, el amor está muerto. Por tanto, la misión es y será siempre poner en práctica la buena nueva del Evangelio: Por sus frutos los conoceréis!

Dear brothers and sisters in the risen Christ, during the liturgical season of Easter we have experienced God's infinite love for man. Now comes the time to give God a response of love in our Christian life day by day. "If you love me you shall keep my commandments," Jesus tells us in the gospel, and we want to be consistent in offering Him the works of our love. When a friend leaves we tell him how much we love him, we remember the best moments, we make many promises. On the evening of Holy Thursday the cenacle was transformed into a stage of farewell, the most historic, the most transcendental. Jesus Christ knew well that it was the last encounter he would have with his friends and took the opportunity to leave us as a gift, as a recommendation and as a promise: The Holy Eucharist, His commandment to love one another, and the promise of the Holy Spirit with the abundance of His gifts. In relating love and commandment, Christ reveals to us his inheritance of love, when we forget ourselves and give ourselves to others, when we are in solidarity and see the face of Christ in those who suffer, in the poor, in the humble, in the abandoned, in the small. Love becomes reality when it crystallizes in works. Without proof, love is nothing but a noble, but empty feeling. Without proof, love stays in mere words and, in the end, is a great disappointment. Without proof, love is dead. Therefore, the mission is and always will be, to put into practice the good news of the Gospel: *By their fruits you will know them!*

CADA UNA DE LAS PARTES DE LA MISA

Ritos iniciales

46. Los ritos que preceden a la Liturgia de la Palabra, es decir, la entrada, el saludo, el acto penitencial, el Señor, ten piedad, el Gloria, y la colecta, tienen el carácter de exordio, de introducción y de preparación.

La finalidad de ellos es hacer que los fieles reunidos en la unidad construyan la comunión y se dispongan debidamente a escuchar la Palabra de Dios y a celebrar dignamente la Eucaristía.

En algunas celebraciones, que se unen con la Misa, según la norma de los libros litúrgicos, se omiten los ritos iniciales o se realizan de modo especial.

THE INDIVIDUAL PARTS OF THE MASS

The Introductory Rites

46. The rites preceding the Liturgy of the Word, namely the Entrance, Greeting, Act of Penitence, Kyrie, Gloria, and collect, have the character of a beginning, introduction, and preparation.

Their purpose is to ensure that the faithful who come together as one establish communion and dispose themselves to listen properly to God's word and to celebrate the Eucharist worthily.

In certain celebrations that are combined with Mass according to the norms of the liturgical books, the Introductory Rites are omitted or performed in a particular way.

Natural Family Planning Classes

The next three-part series of classes on the sympto-thermal method of natural family planning is scheduled to begin Saturday, June 3, from 2-4:30 P.M. at St. Pius X Catholic Church in Urbandale. Cost is a one-time fee of \$130 for all course materials, classes, one year of consultation with certified instructors, a one-year digital subscription to Family Foundations magazine and one-year subscription to CycleProGo app. Financial

CCL also offers two supplementary classes designed to help couples with natural family planning during post-partum and pre-menopause. The sympto-thermal method of natural family planning uses a cross-checking system based on three signs of fertility and is 99 percent effective in postponing pregnancy when used properly.
